* Higher educational institutions have the right to convert up to 90% of the planned in the curriculum study hours into supervised self-study hours of a master (except the series of disciplines for candidate exams and a preliminary).

** It is recommended that optional disciplines in the curriculum should constitute up to 50% from the total number of study hours of the higher educational institution component.

*** Research work load is approximately 1500 study hours, 22 hours of research per week is planned for the 1st semester, 24 hours - for the 2nd semester, 24 hours - for the 3^d semester, 26 hours - for the 4th semester. Research work load includes research for thesis, participation in scientific conferences, workshops etc.

**** Intermediate supervision of a master's individual plan is to be performed not less than twice a semester.

***** It is recommended that not less than 50% of self-study hours should be planned in the curriculum while planning academic studies.
